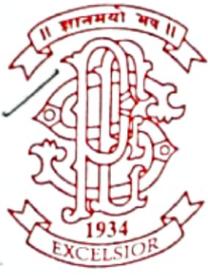

1. Enhancing Curriculum Delivery

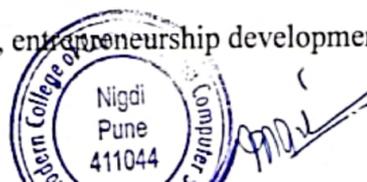
- Leverage ICT tools such as Learning Management Systems (LMS), digital boards, and virtual labs for an enriched learning experience.
